Dr. Ray Rubio has been in private practice at Westlake Complementary Medicine in Los Angeles for over a decade, and was on clinical staff at the Toluca Lake Health Center, "a multidisciplinary outpatient medical clinic," for half of that time. He has lectured locally and internationally on Chinese Medicine, and has appeared on radio and television as a guest speaker on the subject of Complimentary Medicine. Dr. Rubio was also the founder of the Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine program at the Los Angeles Free Clinic in conjunction with Emperor's College.

Dr. Rubio has been on Faculty at Emperor's College since 1999 where he instructs students in Herbal Medicine and Oriental Diagnosis. He is also a supervisor in the Emperor's College Clinic. Dr. Rubio is also a member of the American Association of Acupuncture & Oriental Medicine, and is a graduate of the first cohort in the Doctoral Program at Emperor's College of Oriental Medicine.

Dr. Rubio's specialty is Women's Health, with an emphasis in Reproductive Medicine and the treatment of infertility. He works both with patients who would prefer to conceive naturally, and those who will be utilizing assisted reproductive techniques (ART). He speaks to infertility support groups on a regular basis, and is a member of the American and Pacific Societies for Reproductive Medicine (ABORM). He is currently in the process of conducting a clinical trial on the treatment of diminished ovarian reserve with Chinese Herbal Medicine in patient undergoing IVF.

Today, there is tremendous demand for acupuncturists who can work competently and effectively with patients seeking treatment for reproductive disorders/infertility. Because a large percentage of patients who are seeking treatment for infertility with TCM are also utilizing western assisted reproductive techniques (ART), it is imperative that acupuncturists are able to quickly and confidently translate their patient's western reproductive diagnosis and treatment into a safe and effective TCM pattern-based treatment using acupuncture, Chinese herbal medicine, and lifestyle recommendations. This course is designed to offer treatment strategies and clinical pearls for TCM practitioners working with infertility patients.

Female and Male Infertility Part I

In Part I of this course, Ray Rubio focuses on the discussion of western disease diagnoses for reproductive disorders, and shares his knowledge of how to identify the major causes and types of reproductive disorders commonly seen in industrialized nations.

Dr. Rubio's expertise leads you from a thorough reproductive medicine workup, through specific differentiations of reproductive disorders of infertility, including valuable tools such as basal body temperature charting and its relevance to TCM patterns.

Female and Male Infertility II

In Part II of this class, Ray Rubio focuses on the pulse diagnoses associated with specific patterns of female and male infertility. He covers detailed acupuncture and herbal treatments for both female and male infertility.

Dr. Rubio guides practitioners to new understanding of how to stage treatments according to menstrual phases and patterns revealed by the basal body temperature. Detailed herbal treatments and case studies complete the seminar experience.




