Dr. Tan has written *Twelve and Twelve in Acupuncture*, *Twenty-Four More in Acupuncture*, *Shower of Jewels*, *Dr. Tan's Strategy of Twelve Magical Points* and *Acupuncture 1,2,3*. He plans a future book, *Acupuncture 1,2,3 for Internal Disorders*.

In this exciting class, Dr. Richard Tan extends his teaching of Balance Method to include explanations and treatments for trauma and sports injuries. Dr. Tan explains how he uses his five systems of the Balance Method to uncover the magic healing power of acupuncture for any type of trauma and sports injury.




